## **UPDATE TO ALL FAMILY AND FRIENDS**

Hello, we have just been notified by Ottawa Public Health that they will return to St. Pat's to do another Covid19 Vaccination clinic for residents, staff and designated caregivers on Saturday, Jan. 16.

If you are a designated caregiver and would like to have the first dose of the Pfizer Covid 19 Vaccination on Saturday, Jan. 16 please let Cheryl know at [cherylelliott@stpats.ca](mailto:cherylelliott@stpats.ca) by noon tomorrow, Friday, Jan. 15. This clinic date can only be for the first dose and not to receive a second dose of the vaccine. OPH will return in 21 days to give the second dose for those who get the first dose on Saturday.

Designated caregivers coming in for the vaccination must provide evidence of a Covid19 negative test in the past 7 days as per the usual procedure.

We need to provide OPH with the number of vaccinations necessary so they have the required supply of the vaccine and that we do not waste any of this extremely valuable resource. Once the vaccine is brought to St. Pat's it must be used at St. Pat's or it will be destroyed.

We do not yet know any details of when the clinic will operate or how it will run. If you do confirm that you want to get the vaccination on Saturday, we will give you further information once we know further detail. Our priority right now is to give OPH the number of people confirming that they will get vaccinated. The consent for the vaccination is attached to the update email and you will be required to bring this for the clinic.

We are very fortunate to have this opportunity provided to us, and I hope that there are a lot of people who can take advantage of this to protect themselves, the residents and the staff.
