UPDATE TO ALL FAMILY AND FRIENDS

Hello, over the past few days we have had 3 positive rapid tests results. There are 5 residents who are considered low risk contacts and are being monitored and will be tested on day 5 from the contact. With the new protocols, residents are not required to isolate due to a low risk contact. Any resident with symptoms will be in isolation and a test is completed.

Eye Protection

Any staff member, designated caregiver, volunteer or visitor who is in contact with a positive Covid person is considered a low risk contact if they are wearing both a surgical mask and eye protection. However, if you are not wearing eye protection and are a close contact, you are considered a high risk contact. This will mean that you cannot come into a high risk organization, which includes LTC Homes, for 10 days. Staff, volunteers, students, contracted service providers must wear eye protection at St. Pat's. We are strongly recommending that designated caregivers and visitors wear eye protection for this reason.

We are returning to a schedule for the updates of every Wednesday. An update will be provided if there is urgent information that we need to share.
