New Mask Requirements

As per the update on Friday November 3, we have now implemented the Ministry of Long Term Care new mask requirements.

- Staff, students, volunteers and support workers will be required to wear masks on each resident home area.
- Staff, students, volunteers and support workers are required to wear a mask in any gathering of residents even off of the home area such as during Mass, a recreation program in the Gathering Place or other areas. Masks will not be required in the lobby or in offices at this time.
- We know that visitors and caregivers, family and friends want to keep residents safe. You are strongly encouraged to wear a mask when on a resident home area. You may remove your mask when alone in the resident's room.
- Masks will be available at the main entrance as well as the entrance to each resident home area as of Tuesday November 7. The masks that we currently have in stock have a visor attached to them. It is not required to wear eye protection at this time as we are not in an outbreak. The visor can be removed if you prefer.
